

Leadership in Medicine for the Underserved/Vulnerable Program

Michigan State University College of Human Medicine, in partnership with Synergy Medical Education Alliance, is pleased to offer a unique medical student clinical education program at the CHM Saginaw Campus. The program, Leadership in Medicine for the Underserved/Vulnerable (LMUV) will graduate a cohort of physicians who possess, in addition to the fundamentals of knowledge and skills for the medical degree, a special set of knowledge, skills and attitudes that will enable them to lead efforts to address the needs of medically underserved/vulnerable populations in the United States and global arenas.

Where can this special curriculum lead you? The short answer: any place you desire. Imagine leading a rural hospital to provide care to an underserved area. How about designing and starting a clinic in an urban inner city location where multiple disciplines provide care? Would you like the opportunity to travel internationally to work in rainforest village clinics or refugee settings in Central America? What about Africa and its many people in need—Is there a place for you there? Wherever your imagination leads, the Leadership in Medicine for Underserved/Vulnerable program will help to prepare you for your future career.

This program has three components: rural, urban, and international. Students choose between all or some combination of these core areas in developing their skills in caring for underserved/vulnerable populations. While meeting the traditional medical student clinical requirements, experience in rural and urban healthcare is part of the clinical experience. Students have the opportunity to select either rural/urban or international medicine for their three required electives --**HM 621, HM 629, HM 631** that comprise this program during the 3rd and 4th years. In addition to the regularly scheduled clerkship activities in the 3rd and 4th year, students will also participate in community health programs, didactics and learning sessions, as well as medical Spanish activities that will enable them to interact in the clinical setting and in development/implementation of public health projects.

3rd Year Program for the Saginaw CHM Student

The 3rd year students in the Saginaw “Leadership in Medicine for the Underserved/Vulnerable” program will consist of 14 months in duration, from July of one academic year through August of the next academic year (e.g. July 2010-August 2011). Students will rotate through clerkships as a group.

July/August	Internal Medicine, Family Medicine, or Pediatrics
Sept/Oct	Internal Medicine, Family Medicine, or Pediatrics
Nov/Dec	Internal Medicine, Family Medicine, or Pediatrics

January	Planning for the Leadership in medicine for the Underserved/Vulnerable Elective (HM 621) . This course has been added to the third year schedule and includes a two week period of time to develop skills in travel medicine, cultural competency including history/economics/politics, clinical skills in the developing world, preparatory activities for underserved/urban health care and public health project planning. Students are then assigned to learning activities for the last 2 weeks of January to immerse them into the cultural/health arena associated with their assigned clinical community.
February	Underserved/Vulnerable Medicine Elective (HM 629) . This elective has been added to the third year schedule. This includes a one month clinical and public health experience in Central America as assigned by the CHM family.
